

Mr. Sherman stated that he had been evaluated by the Court Page 26 of 61  
 Department in 1998 or 1999, was evaluated pursuant to Welfare  
 Code section 5150 "several times" and another evaluation was  
 conducted in a hospital in Elk Grove or South Sacramento. Mr. Sherman stated  
 who evaluated him came to the conclusion that his mental health was not

of some background, in 1997, Mr. Sherman was charged and thereafter  
 convicted by jury in early 1998 of three counts of refusing to leave a business  
 requested to do so and one count of harassing telephone calls. He  
 was placed on three years of summary probation and given a jail sentence of 30  
 days. Within two months, in May of 1998, he was charged with interfering with  
 business at a public agency, and was again convicted by jury of the  
 same in October of 1998. He was, once again, placed on a three year  
 probationary grant. In approximately one year, in October 1999, he was charged  
 with violation of a court order. Again, he was convicted by jury, this conviction  
 occurring in February 2000. He was placed on a two year probationary grant  
 and served at least 30 days in jail. In February 2003, he was charged with three  
 counts: interfering with lawful business at a public agency, resisting arrest and  
 assault on a public transit officer. On May 27, 2003 he was, once again,  
 convicted by jury and was given a three-year-probationary grant and a 40 day jail  
 sentence along with other terms which included a class on anger management.  
 In September and November, 2003, as well as in January 2004, he was  
 charged as is described above.

In addition, if I am correct, Mr. Sherman will readily acknowledge that he has  
 been arrested many other times. While our records are incomplete,  
 computerized and other records reveal at least the following court case numbers  
 which do not include cases in which the District Attorney's Office rejected the  
 charged charges and in some cases there may have been multiple offenses:
